Twenty retirees joined in laughter and sharing at the annual Ridge Meadows Retired Teachers' Friendship Potluck luncheon. The tables, set with a Valentine theme, provided a warm welcome to all in attendance. Thank you to everyone for contributing such a variety of delicious food to the potluck table and for all those who helped with the setup and clean up.

Ross Dunning was our first speaker. Ross Dunning put up a display table of items, textile and other, depicting Peruvian culture. After the meal, he gave a very interesting and educational presentation about Machu Picchu, the lost city of the Incas in Peru. Machu Picchu is one of the world's most extraordinary archaeological sites. Its name comes from an ancient Quechua word that means "old mountain" and, indeed, its location (elev. 2400 meters) is on a mountain slope high above the Urubabamba River. This "Lost City of the Incas", though known to locals at the time, was "discovered" by Professor Hiram Bingham in 1911. Its construction possibly dates to the times of Tupac Inca Yupanqui, the final era of the Inca empire. In 1983, UNESCO declared it a World Cultural and Natural Heritage site. Unfortunately, due to technical



problems, we were unable to enjoy a slideshow of Ross' adventures to, and at, Machu Picchu. It will be rescheduled for our Sept. Breakfast.

Judy Bergen from "Love Guatemala" was our second speaker. In 2010 Judy and Philip Bergen sold their home in Abbotsford, BC and moved to Guatemala for 6 months, on a mission to help improve the lives of villagers in Guatemala. In 2013 they were granted temporary residency and since then have homes in Guatemala and Canada. Judy has been involved in construction of family housing projects, in providing books for children from kindergarten to grade 7, in organizing soup kitchens and a community feeding program. Judy's mission work, Love Guatemala Canada, is associated with Commission To Every Nation. CTEN is a servant organization whose mission is "FINDING those who are lost, SERVING those who are under-resourced and LOVING those who have been forgotten."

We enjoyed a very informative slideshow about the projects of CTEN in Guatemala. Many of us enjoyed shopping at Judy's table of Guatemalan items; the bracelets were especially sought after, with orders placed for more. Love Guatemala Canada is well-worth supporting. Having problems with Green Shield??

The move to Green Shield was a decision of the Teachers' Pension Board of Trustees – not the BCRTA. The decision was made following an open competition; other insurance companies were invited to submit proposals and GSC won the competition. The BCRTA plays no role in this as we have no direct contractual relationship with GSC.

- 1 The GSC plan is like the former Blue Cross plan both in design and service. GSC has worked to ensure affordability by not increasing premiums this year and has also worked to be more precise, strict and consistent in interpreting the agreement and in accepting or denying claims.
- 2 If a problem occurs:

a) Contact Green Shield directly and try to solve the problem with an agent of GSC.

Your Pension!!

We can look forward to twelve payments this year but, if we look back one hundred years, our predecessors had less to celebrate as the New Year began. In fact, teacher pensions were a concern. In 1918 outstanding teachers could be rewarded for long and faithful service only by a special act of the legislature. This was done in a few isolated cases. The then fledgling BCTF advocated for a pension of 1/60 of the average salary for the last ten years' work for each year of service. In 1921 changes were made to the Civil Servant's Pension Act to allow for teachers to receive pensions - but pensions were to be given only where school boards chose to give them and school boards could only grant them after receiving permission from local municipal councils. In the end not one teacher in the province ever collected a pension under this provision. In 1918, very few teachers received money upon retirement; in 2018, over thirty-six thousand retirees will receive monthly TPP payments. Your years of hard work and wellmanaged contributions have paid off.
