It is the largest, independent, and free-standing seniors center in the province and runs the largest Adult Day Program in Fraser Health. It is a unique and critical resource for seniors in Langley that has tremendous impact, especially for our most vulnerable seniors.

Kate is responsible for leading the operations of the organization and building capacity for growth. Under her direction, the organization has leaned into its leadership role and is forging a new path forward to better meet the needs of seniors in Langley. Her early successes include securing a \$15,000 grant from the Township of Langley, a jubilant Seniors Week, Langley's first Silver PRIDE, the most successful Holiday Fundraising

Campaign ever, and creating an organizational culture that is positive, inclusive, and purpose driven.

Thirty-five years ago, Kate made a conscious decision to work in the non-profit sector – she wanted her career to have meaning. She has worked for some of our region's leading charities including Vancouver Opera, BC Cancer Foundation and Langley Memorial Hospital Foundation. She is known to be a strategic and caring relationship- builder and a high-performing and skilled fundraiser. Career highlights include her 11 years at Vancouver Opera; opening the Abbotsford Hospital and Regional Cancer Centre; and leading the Langley Memorial Hospital Foundation's \$15million campaign for a new Emergency Department and MRI Suite - the campaign surpassed its target and raised \$17.6million.
