You can imagine how much time it would take me to send an e-mail message to more than 500 of our LRTA members if I did it on an individual basis. By creating 'group' lists, and then sending one message to several 'groups' at a time, I am able to pare down my emails significantly. This used to work great...

But, whether it's due to Shaw beefing up security, or for some other reason, I have been very frustrated with how much of my emails have ended up in our members' 'junk' or 'spam' folders! If you are a Shaw customer, I would urge you to put my LRTA email address (<u>Irta.35@gmail.com</u>) on your 'whitelist' so that my messages end up in your regular Shaw 'inbox' and not in your 'junk' or 'spam' folders. Thanks to one of our members' due diligence, I am able to share how to do this. Please follow the instructions below and see if that makes a difference.

For a detailed explanation on how to do this, go to https://www.whitelist.guide/shaw/

In the meantime, I have pared down my 'group' lists for Shaw customers so I am sending messages to fewer than thirty people (as opposed to over 150) at a time. Please check your '**junk'** or '**spam'** folders at least once a week to see if you have messages that should NOT be in there. You may find other important messages that should not have ended up there, too!


The Langley Website - A Page - Within a Page - Within a Page

When we disbanded our website (Langleyrta.ca) we hired a firm to reproduce our website choosing the BCRTA as our host. Our website is embedded within the BCRTA website along with the websites of many branches. Although some changes can be made and articles added we are really limited to making changes to the core articles copied from our old website.

This link opens the home page of the BCRTA Website. Although most home pages can be bypassed, this is not one in that category. It contains important links to the LATEST News affecting retired teachers. Scroll down the page. At the bottom of the home page there is an explanation -- Green Shield was on Strike. I wish I did this earlier as I had a lot of problems with my Green Shield claims that at my age, was not good for my heart pressure.



When one becomes familiar with the BCRTA website, the home page can be bypassed, and go directly to our website's home page -- https://bcrta.ca/langley/. From here, one can link to our History of Langley Schools https://bcrta.ca/langley/history/

Our HISTORY, which was researched and written in the late 1990's, went through many reviews and edits before being published in 2004 by a group of LRTA members headed by Norm Sherritt, Maureen Pepin, Harry McTaggart and many resource contributors. Lately errors and omissions have been reported. Each school received a copy, and in 2010 we scanned the pages for our website adding staff pictures. Lately errors and omissions have been reported.

We can't change the history as published, but we can add corrections. We can also add news items or additions. Please feel free to send us any information that can add to our past exciting years in Langley Schools. Here are two such updates recently submitted to us:

Patricia Elementary School, An Update by Irvin Redekopp

I was the Head Teacher of Patricia Elementary from 1962 when the Otter room was added to the premises, and I stayed at Patricia for those first six years. in 1962, Patricia had Grades 1-3 in one room, and I had Grades 4-6, and it stayed that way for my six years. Susan Toews was the primary teacher when I arrived and stayed until Leona Fritzke came on the scene. In my first year, we still had two outhouses, had to draw water from the well, and each room had an oil heater. The joining of the two rooms in 1963 was constructed when school was in, making the whole area extremely muddy and boards had to be laid down for student travel. It should also be mentioned that Patricia Hall was made available to us for our Christmas concerts.



Topham Elementary School, An Update by Linda Clark

I attended Topham Elementary School when it first opened and if I remember correctly, it was Peter Raymond* who was the first head teacher and principal. He taught Grade 5/6 and I think Mrs. Hoogey was my teacher in grade 1. Then Vera Paget came the next year for grade 1/2 and she was there long enough to teach my children many years later.
