Safety Travel Apps

There were many requests for Claire's Safety Apps for the smart traveller. Most of these are free, but it is advisable to upgrade to the paid version if there is one. That usually is an inexpensive upgrade and gets rid of all the annoying ads and often unlocks extra features. All are available in the Apple App Store and Google Play Store. Here is the list from her presentation and a couple more:



EmergenSee: transmit video, audio & GPS to friends/family.



In Case of Emergency or "ICE": puts emergency info on your lock screen for 1st responders; works when phone is locked.



Smart Traveler: travel alerts & warnings; entry/ exit requirements; laws; location of Canadian embassy



•mPassport: local brand equivalent of medicine; locates medical services



Google Translate: easy translation. You can even translate street signs with your camera. You may also consider the iTranslate app.



•XE Currency: real time currency conversion (free)



Health App: iPhone only. Does the work of The ICE app. Track walking and much more. See <u>Apple Support</u> to set up the ICE feature.



Triplt: travel itinerary organizer. The inexpensive pro upgrade is best. Creates an editable itinerary of your entire trip.



Duolingo: learn a language. There are many similar ones out there. Some are very expensive.



Google and Apple Maps: mapping and directions. For navigation and exploring driving and now for transit and walking directions for most major cities in the world. Use Apple's 3D flyover and Googles Street view to visit your destinations before you get there.



Then use Trivago and Trip Advisor to locate that great hotel with a \star \star \star \star rating.

Heritage Report

Surrey's Early Island School

One of Surrey's earliest schools was built on Barnston Island, which is situated in the Fraser River between Surrey and Pitt Meadows. The island is only accessible through a five-minute ferry ride from Surrey off 104th Avenue across Parson's Channel.

The original little schoolhouse was built bordering the dike and accommodating a small number of students. Later a larger school was erected in the centre of the island to better meet local student needs. The official name of the structure was Margaret V. McKee School and operated from 1903 to about 1957. Student numbers, however, remained low resulting in the building's closure and its students being transported to Anniedale Elementary. Nothing remains of the old school but a part of the chimney. Surrey School District still owns two acres in the middle of the island
