Finally, delegates were chosen for the **annual BCRTA Convention** at Vancouver Sept. 21-23. I will be attending as President; Paul and Leslie will also attend. As two delegates have their expenses paid by the Provincial organization, the meeting voted to have our branch pay for a third delegate.

2018-19 to feature Information Meetings


