Website Committee Report

Since Feb 24 of 2020, there was no Technical support manager for our website. During July we advertised informally and formally, using LinkedIn, to find a new technical support manager. We interviewed four Vancouver-based applicants and, having budgeted a low hourly wage of \$30, we chose a young man interested in helping folks with their website infrastructure and a willingness to learn our Drupal-based website. Jeffrey Nguyen was a keen helper and especially useful at our Virtual general meetings, patiently assisting those needing to get fully connected on ZOOM. For the next 4 months we struggled to update the vrta.ca website and stop the repeated Security Updates Needed alerts we were getting. In October the website crashed as a security update failed and it required an urgent call to our website host, Canadian company HORDE, to restore it with a backup that they happened to do 24 hours earlier. We now pay for a monthly backup plan so we can update the website with peace of mind.

In January, we found there were still major security updates to do and we agreed to hire an IT Drupal specialist to secure our website. Vanessa Cleary, whom we had previously interviewed, was chosen and she got to work right away, gradually updating the site from the 2017 Drupal version to the 2021 ver-

sion, requiring 7 major upgrades and the development of an alternate test site to sort out the complexities.

It is very humbling coordinating our Volunteer website committee with our two IT specialists and the wonders of a Drupal website. Vanessa has enabled us to continue as "green" volunteers to update the Notices and Images of upcoming events by ourselves while making the site more sophisticated, robust and secure. We hope to add further features and developments to the site

If you have a website design background or enjoy learning about and tinkering with this type of communication tool, feel free to JOIN the VRTA Website committee and contribute your ideas. The committee meets about 5 times a year to update the Event news on the website and help do write-ups on the other sections of the website.

I want to thank the VRTA website committee for 2020 -2021 and it's core members: Barbara Mikulec, Norma Westrom, Winola Chu, and Elaine Anderson with occasional participation from Anastasia Mirras and Ali Pollard. Each participant provided valuable help by writing an article or finding a suitable image and then uploading these onto the correct spot on the website over the course of the year.

Treasurer's Report and Budget for 2021-2022

This financial summary represents the state of the VRTA Branch as of June 30, 2021. Regarding our revenue, the overall income from our lunches and seminars was nil since the Covid-19 pandemic closed down all gatherings. A GST refund was received from the Provincial government for money charged over the past 4 years for the printing and mailing of the TABLOID. Nothing was spent directly on lunches and workshops. Looking at the Budget for the year ahead, there remains uncertainty about


when lunches and workshops will be resumed. We anticipate more costs related to the website and to the recent hiring of a part-time professional technical administrator along with a ZOOM support manager. The proposed budget should leave the VRTA with a healthy balance of approximately \$26 000 by the end of next June, 2022.


Financial Charts

Theatregoers look forward to the return of live stage performances soon but In the meantime, this new podcast titled *This Is Something Else: Consciously Eclectic Histories of the Arts Club* has been launched, giving some interesting facts:

- ♦ The Arts Club of Vancouver was founded by Yvonne Firkin in 1958 as a private club for local artists and entertainers.
- ♦ In 1964 the company opened its first stage at a former gospel hall at the corner of Seymour and Davie. It was called **The Arts Club Theatre**; it continued there for twenty-seven years when it was closed for demolition in 1991.
- ♦ Michael J. Fox, Ruth Nicol. Janet Wright, Ann Mortifee, Brent Carver, Nicola Cavendish, Morris Panych and Anosh Irani are among the many people whose careers were launched at **The Arts Club**.

- ♦ In 1979 the company grew to include **The Granville Island Stage** and in 1983 **The Revue Stage**.
- ♦ The Stanley Theatre was opened in 1998 with the big-band production of Swing which featured Michael Buble in one of his earliest onstage performances.
- ♦ In 2015 The Revue Stage moved to **The Goldcorp Stage** at the BMO theatre Centre in Olympic Village; in 2020 this was renamed **The Newmont Stage**.
- ♦ Bill Millerd was Artistic director from 1972 to 2018. He is the longest-serving director of a Canadian theatre company and was awarded the Order of Canada in 1994 for his many contributions to Canadian theatre. Ashlie Corcoran is the present Artistic director. We, the audience, look forward to many more productions and will be thrilled when live theatre returns again!
