
IT'S RETIREMENT TIME AGAIN!

Orest Pyrch and the Metro Vancouver Friendship Force

Orest has always been a champion of diversity and peace. As a university student, he gave up his studies in science to become a teacher and continued to attain a Masters Degree in Special Education and eventually a Doctorate in the same field. He always wanted to promote the well being of individuals with physical and mental disabilities, as well those who are disadvantaged, in Canada and other countries.

Early in 2005, a friend's cousin from Lethbridge, Alberta visited us. He was a member of the Lethbridge chapter of *Friendship Force International*. His experiences and the values of FFI sparked a keen interest in this organization in Orest and he envisioned bringing this concept to Metro Vancouver as he felt we have a lot to offer visitors from other countries. Orest began a more detailed search into the organization and discovered that a rep would be arriving in the Lower Mainland soon. He became charged with excitement and gathered our closest friends to listen to a senior representative of the Canadian chapters of FFI from Ottawa. She was able to provide more detailed information and helped Orest set the path towards obtaining a Charter for our club. We received our Charter in 2005.

Then the real work began. We were faced with having two incoming Friendship Force clubs the next year - one from Pau, France and the other from Hertfordshire, England. Finding host families, organizing activities, and making arrangements for transportation was a monumental task. He had to enlist friends and neighbours to offer their homes for bed and breakfast as our club was too small to provide accommodations at that time. Luckily, we were able to provide each club with a fun filled program without any problems.

In early 2007, our club was given the opportunity to travel to New Zealand where we were hosted by Friendship Force members in both the North and South islands of that country. Since then, our club has grown to include members from Langley to North Vancouver. We have annual opportunities to both host and travel to visit Friendship Force clubs from all around the world. Many members have developed lifelong friendships here and abroad practicing acceptance, knowledge of our diverse world and promoting peace and love to all.



Orest Pyrch passed away in November 2020. To honour the founder of Friendship Force Metro Vancouver, club members decided to plant a memorial tree & plaque at the *Derek Doubleday arboretum*, just west of the Langley airport. We hope to bring ambassadors from other clubs there for a walk & picnic when journeys are allowed to start again.



Friendship Force clubs are in more than 60 countries and in 6 continents. The mission is to promote global understanding & goodwill through homestay journeys.

He had a natural ability to place himself in other peoples shoes and this came out when coaching or as a spectator, where he would often be found taking the shot from the side-line, the couch, or the stands.

He had a sharp tongue that would never bite. He loved to be social and could easily parry back a witty retort to anyone, from his own family, to the star athlete, to the timid five year old in kindergarten—always from a place of kindness and play. He was so animated when reading a story and his attention and excitement was infectious.

Ron also had a deep connection to the quiet of nature and he loved a good vista. The most peaceful moments he had were those in reflection overlooking nature. He stayed connected to it by wearing sandals in the winter and lining his office with paintings of mountains, forests, wolves, and deer.

Ron gave so much love to everyone he knew and that love will forever be with all of us.
