





We appreciate the time and effort you took

Greensleeve Program

So many of us were interested in learning more about the Greensleeve program that Diana Cruchley mentioned at the workshop on Thursday.

You will be happy to know that the ADRTA is planning a workshop in October for Advance Care Planning given to us by Fraser Health Advance Care Planning Team. At this workshop you will receive information and a Greensleeve for your fridge. More details in the coming months!



WHAT IS A GREENSLEEVE?

A Greensleeve is a plastic folder that holds important documents regarding your health care wishes. It may contain your Advance Care Plan, MOST (medical orders for scope of treatment), EDITH, medication list, Representation Agreement, Advance Directive, and other health related forms.

WHO SHOULD HAVE A GREENSLEEVE?

A Greensleeve can be used by anyone in primary, community, acute or long-term care and is particularly beneficial for people living with a chronic health care condition or advancing illness who may need emergency medical care. The Greensleeve is best kept on or near your fridge. Paramedics are trained to first look there for any advance care documents.
