This year, we received \$3765 in annual membership fees.

Our assets, consisting of \$10,795 in the bank, plus \$83 in petty cash, totaled \$10,878 at the end of June 2022. As we resume normal life, with regular in-person meetings with interesting presenters, and regular lunches, this sum will be gradually reduced over the next several years, although we will strive to maintain a reasonable balance in order to protect against unexpected expenses. For example, if we were to lose the ability to use District and/or CTA facilities for meetings and other activities such as newsletter printing and mail-outs, we would have considerable new costs.

And now for today's feature challenge, with thanks to **John Pope** for the idea. There are some words which, though spelled the same, can be pronounced differently, and have different meanings. They are called **heteronyms**. For example, the word "content" can have either the first or the last syllable emphasized, as in the following sentence: **The teacher was content with the content of the students' projects.**

There are other variations, as well, as in the following example: When BCAA moved into a high-rise office building they became the tower in the tower.
