

Launch for Heritage Committee's Book Kris Nellis, Co Chair Heritage Committee

The PGRTA Heritage Committee's book Reflections: Interviews of School District #57 (Prince George) Retired Educators was launched at École Lac des Bois on Tuesday, September 24th. The book contains interviews of 43 educators, 29 of whom are still living in Prince George. Fourteen of them attended the book launch and had the opportunity to purchase the book. We were able to sell it for \$20, less than half of the printing costs, due to a \$1200 grant we received from the BCRTA. We will also be providing a complimentary copy to a number of community organizations, including the Public

Library, CNC and UNBC. This is possible because of the grant we received.

The other Heritage Committee members, cochair Cheryl Mikulasik, Robyn Naylor, Maria Marchetti, Aleta MacFadden and Sandra Hay were also in attendance. Cheryl and Maria made and dispensed the beverages, Robyn and Aleta handled the book sales and receipts, Sandra snapped lots of photos and I welcomed everyone and read excerpts from a number of the interviews. Two PGRTA executive members, Linda Campbell and Debbie Page, also joined us as well as George Davison, the Chair of the City of Prince George Heritage Commission. Linda thought to invite George as she is also a member of the Heritage Commission. Everyone enjoyed chatting with the interviewees and hearing some of their memories read aloud.

The Heritage Committee is proud of the book, which was four years in the making, and was pleased to share it with the interviewees. Those living locally, but unable to attend, have been contacted and several have now had the book delivered. We hope that everyone enjoys rereading their own interview and reading the interviews of their fellow
